WE ARE CHURCHES OF CHRIST

125 years ago, Church Planter Thomas Bates arrived in Fremantle to begin the work of establishing a movement of Churches of Christ in WA. After seven weeks of meetings and a baptism service at the Swan River witnessed by 500 people he wrote, "Seldom, I think, has a missionary movement been made more opportunely than in the present instance nor with greater promise of permanent success. Seven weeks of labour have confirmed in me the belief that Perth will one day contain one of the largest churches in the Colonies ..."

Throughout the history of Churches of Christ in WA, we have been a people dedicated to being On Mission. The first gathering of WA Churches in April 1898 took as its theme the topic of what it means to be Churches of Christ: "Its Beginning, Its Progress, Its Demands, Its Prospects".

Our Association has weathered seasons of growth, decline, discussions about uniting with the Baptists and the preservation of local church autonomy. It has established missional endeavours, social welfare enterprises and always, always a passion for the proclamation of the Gospel.

In 2015, we face the challenges of our time on the platform of faithful proclamation and witness of those who have gone before. We continue to believe that a missionary movement in this State is needed right now and we believe that the promise of success in the Lord as a result of our labour is a promise we too can claim. We continue to be a people who establish missional endeavours, grapple with questions around sustainability and viability as a movement, and the strengths and weakness of autonomy. Above all else, we remain a people with a passion for the proclamation of the Gospel. We remain On Mission.

Perth has grown rapidly and its culture has shifted significantly. We are, in effect, missionaries in our own land. For this reason, the Board and COCWA Staff are working to ensure that the combined resources of the churches are stewarded well so that they can be focused and directed towards supporting local churches as they seek to bring people into the light and life of Christ.

As we celebrate 125 years, it is good to be reminded of our beginnings and the progress of Churches of Christ in WA. I believe we can be

confident of our prospects as we walk in the light of the promise that the Lord has given to us: that our churches will be full of new believers. But how might we contemplate the 'demands' that our forefathers pondered at their first gathering? Drawing upon the 'distinctives' of our movement, I offer the following thoughts:

1. EVERY FOLLOWER OF CHRIST IS ON MISSION TO LEAD OTHERS TO CHRIST

As an On Mission movement, it has always been part of our understanding of ourselves that every follower of Jesus has the responsibility and privilege of living out and proclaiming the Gospel in and through their lives. We are a grass-roots movement of people. Being On Mission is not the special responsibility of a set aside group of people or leaders as 'ministers.' It is the prerogative of the whole people of Christ's church.


2. ON MISSION CHURCHES VALUE PARTNERSHIP We are Christians only but do not see ourselves as the only Christians. We recognise that we are a part of the Body of Christ and whilst we value our distinctiveness, we know that as the Body of Christ works together we help one another to show that the Kingdom of God has come. In Christ we are collaborative and not competitive.

3. ON MISSION CHURCHES ARE ADAPTIVE Methods, structures and forms may change but the Gospel remains the same. There is no doubt that we live in epoch times of sweeping cultural change. God's people have always learnt to rest in and rely upon the presence of the Holy Spirit in order to discern how to reflect and share the Gospel in a particular culture. In Western Australia in 2015 with all of its tensions and paradoxes, we have an amazing faith opportunity to live as salt and light as we look to Christ, particularly through His Word and prayer, and absorb his words deeply into our minds, hearts and souls.

Like never before, we have the opportunity to live freely and innovatively with an optimism and a hope that is substantively different to what the world offers.

2016-2020 STRATEGIC PLAN

Having right-sized the organisation (COCWA) in conjunction with the adoption of new Rules, this year the Board and COCWA Staff have been working towards the articulation of a strategic plan.



Our core purpose is

"To harness the resources and strength of Churches of Christ in WA in order to support local churches and their multiplication initiatives." We look forward to sharing specifics of the strategic plan in 2016.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2015

COCWA Rules: The adoption of the Rules in May was a significant milestone for the churches. One of the great joys for me personally was the opportunity to visit with most of the elders and leaders of the churches to talk through the development and implementation of the Rules. As an Association we strongly affirm the autonomy of the local church and the spiritual responsibility that ministers, elders and leadership teams hold. We trust that as we continue to be together in association, that our combined efforts bless, encourage, strengthen and inspire church leaders so that they can keep their focus on equipping the people within their churches to be On Mission.

State Youth Games 2015: It has been many years since there has been a large number of people responding to an invitation to follow Christ in a

public setting amongst our churches. So it was with great joy that we woke up on Sunday morning of the June long weekend to the news that around 40 young people had responded at the rally on the Saturday night of SYG. There are so many encouraging good news stories about how the young people of our churches are connecting, relating and helping one another through their connection with Youth Vision.

Warwick Stadium: On November 7 we will meet on the courts of Warwick Stadium. It will be 12 months since the churches voted to provide a guarantee to this project. It is an outstanding achievement for everyone concerned, but especially for the Board and Staff of CCSRA to have delivered this project ahead of schedule. Our combined AGM's (COCWA, BEMF & CCSRA) will be a wonderful opportunity to give thanks together for the way that the Lord has blessed this project and to believe together for what the Lord will do in and through the community who accesses this building.

Revolving Capital Fund: For several years this Fund (made up of the previous Revolving Capital Fund and the Centenary Fund) was largely unused by

the churches. It is designed to provide interest free loans of up to \$100,000 for two years for renovation and maintenance projects. Over the past 18 months it has been very encouraging to have 11 churches access the fund. We have seen this as a dramatic increase in the faith of churches as they are looking to invest in their facilities because they want to grow. In September we celebrated the return of funds from the Mundaring and Northam Churches and praise God for faith and giving of the people of those churches.

COCWA Boards and Staff: At the end of 2014, I began to speak to the various Boards and the Staff team about entering into a new season of serving the churches. For most of this year we have been seeking to discern how the Lord wants us to steward resources and structure support. This has meant taking seriously the challenge of questioning what we do and how we operate both as people and in our systems. I want to commend to the churches all those who serve the Association for the ways in which they have all embraced the challenge. I am so grateful for the privilege of serving alongside these wonderful people.

2014-15 CHURCH STATISTICS

We want to exercise some caution this year in interpreting the gathered statistical data. We are aware that many churches are experiencing the challenge of people losing jobs, moving to other locations and are also grappling with the slide in what constitutes a regular attender.

This year's raw data demonstrates that from an overall perspective, adult attendances have remained at the same level as the previous 5 years. Baptisms were lower than in the previous 2 years.

For the first time we asked for churches to tell us how many teens regularly attend youth groups. The number is lower than we hoped to see. In addition, there was a significant reduction in the reported number of children attending weekly services. We again want to exercise caution in reading too much into the raw data as some of the numbers reported as youth may have been previously incorporated into the general question about numbers of children. We cannot ignore the obvious conviction that every church ought to consider ministry opportunities for children and young people as a priority.

Every church cannot ignore the call to be On Mission. As has been observed, "the church is never more than one generation away from extinction." Every Christ follower of any age and at any stage is caught up and included in the mission mandate of Jesus to share the good news of salvation in Christ alone.

For four years now we have been speaking about God's promise to our family of churches: that our churches will be full of new believers. Some have challenged me from time to time about the use of the word "will". Every time I have sought the Lord about the expression, I get the same assurance that the promise is true and it is for us to receive. The question is not, "Will our churches be full of new believers?" but "What is our responsibility as churches made up of followers of Jesus?"

Some have spoken to me about feeling overwhelmed by the challenge of taking hold of this promise; of feeling the pressure to get their church full of new believers. I understand this well! Personally, I continue to trust in Christ who said that He will build His church but have also committed to eager prayer that I will have the opportunity to lead people to Christ. It's been a long time since I have had that privilege. I know that I am not alone in this and as I am honest and share this with others. I am encouraging people to join me in prayer, asking the Lord to give us eyes to see and courage to open our mouths and share the hope that we have in Jesus. It is my hope that by this time next year I will have some stories to tell! In the meantime, I am encouraged by an increased number of 'random' conversations I find myself having with people in shops, in carparks, cafes and in my own family.

PROPERTIES COMMITTEE

The process that started in 2004 with a new Constitution, and continued into 2015 with the adoption of new Rules resulted in the Board reviewing the role of the committee and adopting a new policy for its operation. This has had, and should continue to have, far reaching consequences as the Committee focusses on land matters and COCWA property assets.

Our agenda over the last year has included: PROPERTIES STRATEGIC PLAN

An annual role of the committee is the preparation for Board approval of a Strategic Plan for the properties COCWA owns. From this strategy specific plans for individual properties are developed.

IMPLEMENTATION OF COCWA LAND POLICY

We continued to encourage churches to own land and for all churches on COCWA owned land to enter into either a Deed or a Licence.

COCWA PROPERTIES

Property Management

Properties are mainly managed by COCWA staff with the committee advising when building expertise is needed. Fremantle properties continued to receive attention and this is likely to continue for FY16.

Port Hedland

With the cessation of the church ministry the manse has been refurbished. The church has not

been refurbished as future ministry plans should influence any work carried out. A public expression of interest process is underway to ascertain if any sustainable visions or plans for ministry may require the church site and/or manse.

Property Dealing Disposals

The land in Richardson Road awaits settlement once the Charitable Trust Caveat is removed.

Future Church Sites

This continues to exercise the committee, however funding limits our options in this regard. The committee is also mindful of the potential for considerable maintenance works on key properties.

THE YEAR AHEAD

In addition to the usual and routine matters the year ahead holds for us:

- Involvement in considerations of the future of the Beaufort Street property
- Assessment and feasibilities of underused COCWA land assets to maximise ministry opportunities
- Identification of suitable land for acquisition for future church sites
- Exploration of investment opportunities to return surpluses to fund church site acquisition

ON MISSION IN RETIREMENT

There is a new, true Aussie movie based on the life of Rex Bell called *Last Cab To Darwin*. I haven't seen the movie, but the preview seems profoundly stirring. Rex (Michael Caton), wrestling with being told he has cancer, makes the statement "I'm going to drive my cab as long as I can drive." Ministers about to retire or who have retired have a similar wrestle they must engage. "What is left in life for me now, where do I fit, and what is my value now I am no longer employed by a Church?"

When we come through this after many years of faithful service to our Lord and face the unknown territory of retirement, what statement of resolve will we come out with? "Eat drink and holiday?" Perhaps in the spirit of Caton, "I will live life serving my Lord as long as I can, however I can." One person sent me an article entitled, "Better after sixty five." Again in the *The Last Cab to Darwin*, "Its never too late to live."

My role as pastoral support to retired and retiring ministers involves supporting and equipping ministers for the second half of life and ministry. My focus in this role is that many facets of our lives can be better after retirement.

We may have been in ministry for forty or fifty years taking on study, seminars and personal growth but this is the next chapter in our journey and we haven't passed this way before. Our journeys are all unique and society has some very self-indulgent and destructive messages to our age group. Some of the ways we help equip for this phase of life include:

Seminars: This year we have had Centrelink come and explain the superannuations changes. Michelle Harris from Bethanie also presented an informative and encouraging session with many helpful insights into how we can live with and care for people with dementia. David Van Leen and David Bardsley shared in our Bunbury seminar. David Van Leen shared about the role and support of chaplains in Bethanie while David Bardsley shared about cooperation of the denominations in small country towns. Our next seminar will be training retirees in mentoring the next generation of ministers.

Monthly exhorting emails: This year we have looked at being proactive in retirement for our betterment. I encourage our retirees to live fully in your sixties, seventies and beyond. I write on the

idea that 'optimal health is a mixture of many factors, all interacting in harmony.'

Support and encouragement role: I have sent emails when I know a retiree or spouse has a birthday or other significant occasion simply to say 'you are special', 'you are valued for who you are.' As we age constant health challenges are common to many. Through emails we are able to have our community of retirees stay in touch and embrace our brothers and sisters in prayer and stand in the gap for them. In 2014/15 we have celebrated the lives and ministries of Ken Patterson, Kaye Caporn, John Morrow and Roger Ryall and given them our blessings as we said farewell. I also meet with a number of ministers personally for mutual encouragement as well as a coffee fix.

Graham Carslake annually holds a 'Ministers Recognition Dinner' at Nollamara Church. This year Ross Norling and Ron Cook were recognised and thanked for their years of ministry. Ron was also presented with his College of the Bible Diploma which was a great surprise.

Graham also organises the annual Christmas luncheon for retiree ministers and spouses. It's


a time to stay connected, do some storytelling and have Tania Watson share some inspirational thoughts. Last Christmas saw the largest gathering of people in attendance.

I am available to ministers and chaplains from sixty to seventy plus years of age. I note we have in this group of ministers and chaplains sixteen who may retire within the next five years. There are fifty six who have retired from full time ministry but many of these folk are very active in a variety of ministries and often alongside their spouses. Some of these are also struggling with poor health.

I count it an honour to support these passionate people of the faith. Our greatest desire is to see Churches grow with new believers and we feel privileged to be a part of the local 'cheer squad' encouraging, praying and supporting our local congregations doing ministry in relevant and effective ways.

All of these people and our resources enable us to keep working towards our mission: We champion Churches of Christ youth and young adult ministries through developing, nurturing and resourcing sustainable leaders.

Towards the end of 2013 we engaged the services of Evolve Leadership (Glenn Bergsma) who facilitated a 2 day workshop to help us come up

with a five year strategic plan. We clarified our mission and we settled on seven goals that guide us each year in putting together our operational plan. The goals are:

RESOURCING YOUTH / YOUNG ADULT MINISTRIES

1. We will have developed and implemented a coaching/consulting model that builds youth/young adult ministries. This has been carried out in 20 churches.

IDENTIFYING & DEVELOPING LEADERS

- 2. We will have created a clear and effective leadership development pathway with the majority of youth vision leaders engaged and progressing forward.
- 3. We will offer all youth leaders a minimum of four cluster gatherings per year for mutual encouragement, communication, support and further connection.

RELATIONSHIPS

4. We will provide six spaces per year that promote relationships, create memories and offer spiritual and leadership development.

GOVERNANCE & LEADERSHIP

5. We will have identified, considered and implemented the best structure going forward to

strategically partner with the COCWA movement.

- 6. We will have sourced and secured additional funds in interest bearing revenue and developed ten recurring revenue partners.
- 7. We will have implemented a simple information management system that manages our data, relationships and communication within the Youth Vision community.

Please pray for us as we seek to move forward in our strategic plan. Some of these are BIG HAIRY AUDACIOUS GOALS!

These are some of the things that we have been working on since the last COCWA AGM:

- In November 2014 we hosted ENCORE with the other youth ministry organisations here in Perth. A one day youth ministry conference full of inspiration, training and networking for youth and young adult workers. Our special guest was Krish Kandiah from the UK. It was a fantastic day.
- In January this year we re-birthed 'Forest Edge' - a camp for junior high students held in Waroona. Forest Edge was one of the most fruitful and energetic things that YV used to run through the 90's and early 2000s. It was well attended and we are currently planning to go bigger and better in 2016.



- State Youth Games 2015 was a huge success.
 We had over 950 participants and about 120 adult volunteers. Cameron Barnes and his organising team did a great job once again.

CHURCHES OF CHRIST INSURANCE

Churches of Christ Insurance (CCI) is a national program dedicated to serving Churches of Christ right across Australia. We believe the CCI program provides the highest benefits for our churches. It offers maximum cover in a very cost-effective manner, and is tailored specifically for the insurance needs of the Churches of Christ. This means that churches can enjoy substantial premium savings, while still being ensured they have full coverage for a very broad range of risks.

PROPERTY CLAIMS

We had 22 claims in the 2014/2015 insurance period. The majority of our property claims are from storm damage, burglary/theft and glass breakage. Storm and burglary continue to be the two areas where we see the greatest dollar value of claims. As we approach the summer season it is a good time to get roofs and gutters inspected and trees cut back. Ensuring that in the event of a storm any damage is as a result of the storm and not poor maintenance.

BUSINESS TRAVEL INSURANCE
We have been able to provide a travel insurance

cover at no additional cost to the churches. Employees and volunteers may now be covered for church mission trips, training, and events that are part of the church activities.

VALUATION AND SURVEYS





BEMF: BUILDING THE FUND THAT FUNDS THE BUILDINGS

A major milestone in the history of the BEMF has recently been achieved! The largest loan ever provided by BEMF has been approved for the Churches of Christ Sport and Recreation Association Inc (CCSRA). This loan enables CCSRA to double its amount of courts and sporting events, thus serving the community by accommodating more than 10,000 players every week, across a variety of sport activities.

Churches of Christ Albany Inc have this year been granted a loan, assisting them in the completion of their new church after they had outgrown their current facilities.

These loans are the reason why we exist and reflect the important role that the BEMF plays in providing finance within Churches of Christ in Western Australia. We express our gratitude to the COCWA Board for their collaboration and support in the BEMF operations. Under the guidance of the BEMF chairman, Richard Affleck, and the Board we have implemented a marketing plan, allowing BEMF to grow and operate on a new level.


The BEMF fund has grown by 8% in gross assets, mainly due to commitment and investments from individuals within the Churches of Christ family.

Loans increased by 66% compared to the previous year, which is significant in the progress of fulfilling our objectives. A similar growth in loans is expected for the coming year. Although revenue increased in the 2014/15 financial year, it was exceeded by expenses resulting from the development and implementation of the marketing plan. However, this investment is ultimately aimed at BEMF approving more loan applications from churches.

The development of an internet banking platform is still being researched to improve the delivery of our products and services to our members. This is an ongoing project and with the support from PropCorp and Churches of Christ Financial Services, we expect further progress towards the end of this financial year.

The BEMF continues to perform as a Religious Charitable Development Fund under the Banking Exemption Order No1 of 2011. Ongoing research and development seeks solutions for current and future challenges associated with managing larger volumes of investments and loan applications, and this will have a positive influence in improving internal systems and safety nets. We believe that improving our services and products

will equip us to offer loans where they are needed, to see more churches filled with new believers.


